MONEY, POSSESSIONS AND ETERNITY

Chapter title: Money Possessions and Eternity: Ministry Finances and Fund Raising

This chapter discusses giving outside of the family unit and the support of that unit. There are many worthy causes asking for our money every day. It is up to us as individuals and the Vestry of the parish to choose those we find promoting God's desires which are to "love the Lord your God and your neighbor as yourself". For every secular group relieving distress there is a Christian organization doing the same thing but with an eternal perspective.

Giving to the local church and them acting as a clearinghouse for giving gifts to the needy and to reach the lost is the New Testament direction for the church. Our giving should go first to our local parish because it is our direct source of nourishment, then the elected leaders of the parish decide through prayer where these funds should go.

We at Church of Our Saviour have very capable leadership in the form of our Treasurer and Vestry. We give to worthy ministries, then we pay our staff and then the facility. Susan is able to stretch a dollar a very long distance, because she is encased in prayer. God is working through this parish to reach the lost.

From time to time a special project may need a special call for fund raising, an addition on building, to repair a part of the building due to damage, a special evangelism or missionary support. Then we as the laborers must reach out to God in prayer and ask for his direction.

Speakers, conferences, para ministries, gifts or premiums given in response to a donation are all forms of getting us to give additional funds to worthy causes. The author cautions us to research carefully these requests in order to weed out those who do not have an eternal perspective. The author gives 19 questions which we should ask before we give to an organization. I will make a copy and have them available in the back of the church.

We have come to the end of the stewardship year, with October we will again ask you to consider what the Lord is asking you to give to this parish. There are still more chapters to the book, so I will continue to offer you the insight it provides in dealing with our Money and Possessions for all eternity.
