

MONEY, POSSESSIONS AND ETERNITY

We have continued our discussion of how our money affects our view of eternity. We have spoken about saving – having enough to keep us safe, but not so much that we cannot give to God. How much is enough depends on if you are alone or part of a family. What are your monthly expenses and goals? Insurance: Again, enough to meet the legal requirements and to provide for our basic needs if disaster strikes. Insurance has come to replace the need to depend on others when we need help. Retirement: Up until the 1930's, no one ever retired. They worked until they died as most people were laborers and lived week to week. The Bible refers to "no work, no food". The Bible also says God will provide for his Page 6 of 8

obedient, responsible and wise children who seek first His kingdom. As we look at our particular situation, we need to view these items and see how they reduce or increase our sense of dependence on God. We also looked at some practical ways to control spending. This list comes from the appendix of the book:

- 1. Realize that nothing is a good deal if you can't afford it.
- 2. Recognize that God isn't behind every good deal.
- 3. Understand the difference between spending money and saving money.
- 4. Look at the long-term cost, not just the short-term expense.
- 5. Pray before you spend.
- 6. Examine every purchase in light of its ministry potential.
- 7. Understand and resist the manipulative nature of advertising.
- 8. Learn to walk away from things you want but don't need.
- 9. Realize that little things add up.
- 10. Set up a budget and live by it.
