

MESSAGE FROM THE VESTRY

December 2015

I know this has been a tough year at Church of Our Saviour. We on the Vestry want to thank all the Parishioners who have continued to attend services on a regular basis. Your presence keeps our church alive.

We are continuing with our efforts to find a replacement Priest. Based on the size of our Church we are most likely looking for a part time or retired Priest....a full time priest is not financially possible at this time.

We have made the following steps to help us continue our worship in 2016

- 1) Deacon Randy has arranged for a Priest once a month. Father Frank Lockwood is currently the Priest in Coxsackie and has agreed to help us out. He will be joining us on December 20 and January 17.
- 2) In addition, we have arranged for two Supply Priests in February to celebrate the Eucharist with us.
- 3) We are continuing to work with the Supply Clergy to make sure that we have a Priest at least twice/month during 2016.
- 4) We are finalizing our Church Profile with the Diocese. This is the next stage in our search for a priest.

Finally....we need to get the Rectory updated to make it livable. Please let us know if you can provide help. The Priest coming on February 14 has expressed an interest in staying at the Rectory.

DEACON'S MESSAGE

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

Merry Christmas and a Joyful St. Stephen's Day, or for some, Good Boxing Day.

This time of year can be physically, emotionally and spiritually difficult for many people, for many reasons. People consider their health or financial problems, events in their lives or those they are close to, in their local community or in the world and they can become discouraged. But this is exactly the same world that Our Lord came to save. God in His infinite Love became incarnate to suffer as we do; to know the heartache and grief that we feel; to share with us the pain of living in this world. The same things that are happening to us and around us today were happening two thousand years ago, in some cases different players or illnesses but in all, the same feelings and challenges.
