#### **VESTRY'S VIEWS**

If you have been driving or walking past Our Saviour recently, you will have seen that work has been done on the foundation of the rectory. The vestry approved this work last year, and with the agreeable weather (AKA not a lot of rain) the work commenced. The sides and front of the rectory are complete and the work now turns to the back of the rectory. This work shores up the foundation and prevents the rain and snow melt from entering the cellar and it secures the rectory for the future.

The next structural project is the safe removal of the bee hive that has been built by our industrious friends in the rafters of the church over the altar. When the hive was checked last year using a thermal imaging camera (thank you Bud Godfroy), the hive covered two rafters on the left side of the ceiling as you face the altar. To successfully remove the hive, the slate and the roofing has to be removed and a bee keeper has to come to take the queen and the hive. Then preventative measures should be taken so the area is no longer conducive to attracting bees and the roof has to be closed up.

In order to this do work, the vestry voted to close one of our accounts. This action provides the vestry with the funds to complete this work and have a reserve for any other work that will need to be done, such as repairing the roof over the north end of the church and repointing some of the stonework.

Your vestry works to keep the physical plant of the church and rectory in shape and preserved for future generations. As always, the vestry appreciates your support and your prayers as we carry on our mission.
