FROM THE DIOCESAN DELEGATE

Convention Report

The Diocesan Convention was held from June 9th to the 11th Camp of the Woods in Speculator, New York. We gathered together through the afternoon on Friday enjoying the sunshine and greeting old friends. Our theme "Let Your Light Shine" allowed us to explore new and different ways we might share the Love of Christ to the world.

The Business meeting elected new members to various offices of the Diocese and we passed the budget for 2018.

We approved the resolution for clergy Salary and Benefits: The full resolution is available from the Clerk if you want to see it. For our level, we would be expected to pay \$35,800 per year minimum were we to have full time priest. Recommended compensation for supply clergy is \$130 for one service, \$155 for two services on the same day, \$100 other liturgical services and \$80 per unit for pastoral services beyond services. A unit is a measure of time: morning, afternoon or evening.

After the business was completed, we ventured onto the campus to participate in a number of workshops designed for us to see how we can spread the Light of Christ. Our guest Bishops

were: Bishop Grant and Wendy LeMarquand from The Horn of Africa; Bishop Todd and Patsy McGregor from Madagascar; Bishop John Tarrant from South Dakota; Bishop Parsons from the Arctic and Bishop from Drown and Dramor in Ireland and Father Jacques Deravil from Haiti.

Other presenters were priests and deacons and lay people from the Diocese who are sharing their light in some unique and not so unique ways .

If you are looking for a new and exciting way to study the Bible and get a new look at old words, I suggest the Beth Moore Bible Studies. Karen Love has facilitated two of these at the Spiritual Life Center but they are available online to do as an individual or as a group.

Looking for a way to use up the yarn you have stored? The Prayer Shawl ministry may be just what you have been waiting for. Our ECW participates in this ministry. You can see Mary Young or Carol Lukas for more information.

We had a number of opportunities to learn about various ministries going on around the Diocese from a room full of different types of program material to workshops about music, youth, Bible Study, addiction and how to combat it, SafeGuarding God's Children, a 12 step meeting and puppets.

Each of the Bishops gave a presentation about life in their Diocese and how Christ's light shines there. We worshipped our Lord through Morning Prayer, a healing service, Evening Prayer and Holy Eucharist. The Youth Mass on Sunday morning is always an inspiration and a glorious closing note for the Convention.

Convention is a wonderful way to share the love of Christ with brothers and sisters that live near and far to us and share our beliefs. We are not so different after all. It makes the world a smaller place.

We at Church of Our Saviour may be small but we are mighty. Of the many ways to shine our light to the world that were presented I can tell you we do a lot of them and some not even presented. As we greet each new day, thank God for the days past and the day ahead. Ask Him to show you how to share His love in a new way so our love does not grow stale.

Plan to join the rest of the Diocese at our 100th Convention to be held June 8-10 at Camp of the Woods. The Presiding Bishop Michael Curry will be joining us.
