# From Father Frank Lockwood

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ -

I pray this finds you well as I write to you from the fireside while on vacation on Lake Champlain. The weather started out less than stellar as we were under a heat advisory for the first two days. Rain and wind from the north has cooled things down and lowered the humidity making it far more pleasant even if a bit cloudy.

I am camping with friends I have known for many years. I was first introduced to them by mutual friends. The couple had been dating for some time and were looking to get married. I was asked to officiate for them. This started our friendship and it has continued since.

Recently, the husband met a deer on the road while riding his motorcycle to work late at night. The meeting was not a pleasant one. The deer did not survive. My friend did, but not without complications. His foot was broken and one of his thumbs was dislocated. He has some road rash on his legs, but is otherwise ok. His bike fared better than he with some mostly cosmetic issues. His foot is not in a cast but is splinted and immobilized to begin the healing process with follow up expected in the upcoming weeks with ortho to determine if surgery is necessary and/or beneficial.

He is typically an active man. He cannot attend a barbecue without jumping in to help out. Now, he is relegated to a reclining chair and having to receive support rather than give it. I am blessed to be able to be here and provide assistance to him and his family during this camping trip. You see, he is normally so active and organized that he tries to be prepared for all contingencies. He is now facing the radical change that often comes from a "disaster" and the humbling condition of realizing he is not indestructible.

I know this feeling all too well and have shared with him and his family some of my own experiences that shaped me over the years. This included sharing about my own deer versus motorcycle encounter and the recovery as well as long lasting effects from the same. The feeling of being vulnerable is never an easy pill to swallow when you have been the one looked to for handling all life may throw at you and your loved ones. That vulnerability not only affects the individual but has a profound impact on the ones that love us. It can shake our loved ones' faith/sense of security. It can lead to anxiety that may express as nervous energy, depression, anger or more typically combinations of all in varying degrees throughout the recovery and beyond.

As a believer in God and follower of Christ it brings to mind what so many of the original apostles initially went through following the crucifixion and even later when some first became believers. Yet perhaps this is one additional meaning of Jesus telling us that we must become as children when we come to the faith. Children are naturally vulnerable. They ideally are able to rely on parents and others for their care and security. When those needs are not provided we see this as trauma and it has an effect on the person's development up to and including perhaps even the need for counseling later in life so that healing can take place.

God humbles the proud but exalts the humble. I often laugh at those times when I am cruising along during a service and thinking how well I am reciting the words from the prayer book only to then stumble, stutter, lose my place or even hit a "blank moment". Yeah Father I get it. I got way ahead of you in this.

Do I think that God caused his accident? Absolutely not. It was a deer crossing the road that caused the accident, not God. However, I do believe that God can and will work

with us in an opportunistic way when we allow Him to see us through these types of circumstances. After all, it could have been so much worse.

Are you feeling overwhelmed, vulnerable, facing things that stir up anxiety? Yeah, me too. Is that a time to turn from Him or to Him? Is this a time to prove how well we can handle everything or is it a time to accept the things we simply cannot do on our own and let others, including God, into our lives to help hold us up and carry us through?

I'm going to sit for a while longer and mull these things over.
