REPORT OF ASSIGNED PRIEST

Vestry member Mary Young has faithfully led the Altar Guild and has served the Lord in many ways through her work for our church and Deanery. Vestry member Susan Darcy took over the reigns of the treasury and has gotten us on a steady footing. Mary and Sue designed the PPF stewardship campaign and I for one am looking forward to the conclusion of the campaign at this meeting. Sue Schauder and Marge Mooney co-chaired the Nominations Committee for this year's vestry elections. Vince Teachout and Wyatt Haley will be leaving the vestry and I thank them for their years of service. Wyatt will continue as the chair of buildings and grounds and Vince will keep the web site up and running. The members of the vestry, Junior Warden Molly Laird, Tom Stone, and the clerk of the vestry Eugenia Browning have given of themselves in service to the Lord and this church. My thanks go out to those mentioned for their dedication and assistance in bringing the mission of the Church of Our Saviour to the parish and to the community.

During 2006, several parish meetings were held. These meetings enabled the vestry to update the parish members on events planned or items that were under discussion. They also gave the vestry the opportunity to hear from the members of the parish. The meetings provided the vestry with information that was discussed and taken under advisement. Parish meetings will continue in 2007.

The vestry approved several projects to repair or improve the church building. The bell tower was repaired and the bells once again ring out in the community. Windows in the rectory were replaced and a water filter put in. The large stained glass window facing Rte. 22 was enclosed to protect the glass and allow for a clear view of the beauty of the window. The piano was repaired and tuned and adds its richness to the 10:00 service. One of our children attended Beaver Cross

We continue our support of missions and the Youth for Christ. Bible study continues on the first Thursday of the month. We have begun to have movie nights for families and open our doors to the community at the Opportunity Sale and special services. YOUTH FOR CHRIST

Youth For Christ is a program started by this church as an answer to prayer along with other churches in the valley to present Jesus Christ to the un-churched youth of the New Lebanon Central School District. We are partnered with the national Youth for Christ program. This church has provided the rectory for this program and pays the utilities. We also give a gift each month to assist in paying their operating budget.

Any student of the NLCS systems is eligible to participate in the after school program which is specifically geared to middle school and high school students. Two programs are offered each week. Wednesday afternoon is for middle schoolers with ten students registered; Thursday is for high school students with 14 registered. Adults trained by the Youth for Christ Program supervise the students.

Mary Young serves as our representative to the Board of Directors for this Program. This Board meets once a month and is made up of representatives from the churches who participate and oversee the program.

The students have a snack, activity, Bible study, homework help and free time during the three hours on Wednesday and Thursday. They go to conferences, Beaver Cross, help the community and do special projects such as the Christmas shoebox and the Alpha program for Teens. Most of these students do not have Jesus Christ or a reliable adult in their life. They come from broken or abusive homes. The adults show the love of Christ to the students and how they can break the pattern of their life and become all that Jesus would have them to.

If you are interested in helping with this ministry, contact Mary Young. The program is looking for people to provide food for snacks, community projects, and adults to teach the students basic skills in life such as sewing, cooking and bookkeeping or mentoring a student.
